Share Options (Please check one):

Early Bird Discount (EBD)- A discount will be offered on all share sizes if paid in full by March 1st. The amount of the discount will be based on the share size, as noted above. This deadline will be strictly adhered to.

In this form I will ask for your contact information, what size vegetable share you would like, and if you would like to sign up for any of our optional add-on shares: eggs, flowers, mushrooms, and/or fruit.

3 SHARE SIZE CHOICES:

1. **PREMIUM, ~\$45/week**
Largest size, ideal for a family or couples who cook often. Will contain on average 10-12 items per week and more quantity of some items (*e.g., Basic Shares get 2 tomatoes and Premium Shares get 4*). Additionally, each week Premium Members receive 1-2 smaller harvest vegetables that no other members get.
Premium Members pick/choose your own produce from large produce bins at pick-up.

2. BASIC, ~\$38/week

Our most popular size! Will contain on average 9-10 items, approximately 75% of the Premium Share. Basic Members pick/choose their own produce from large produce bins at pick-up.

3. PRE-BAG, ½ share ~\$30/week

Smallest size option and *pre-bagged* so it's simply a grab & go. Great for single members who want the quickest and easiest pickup option each week. Will contain on average 9-10 items, but less of each item than the Basic Share. This size is approximately 50% of the Premium size. Share cost reflects the price of bagging.

OPTIONAL ADD-ONS:

In addition to any share size/schedule, you can choose optional add-ons.

1. EGGS - \$6.25/week or less

- Delivered weekly for 24 weeks
- Can be added to full share and summer share schedules (no half share option)
- Price: \$150, 1 dozen/week; \$275, 2 dozen/week; \$395, 3 dozen/week; \$505, 4 dozen/week)
yes, these prices are LOWER than last season!
- Birds are free range and on pasture for 8 months of the year, organic in practice but not certified organic, and there is soy in their feed.

2. FRUIT - \$220 for 12 deliveries

- 12 deliveries of fruit, not consecutively, depending on harvest and seasonal availability.
- Available to all share schedules, but may be delivered on weeks when you aren't picking up veg.
- Fruit shares in the past have included berries, cherries and stone fruit in the summertime... apples, plums and pears in the fall.
- Each share is quite large - about 5-7 pounds of larger fruit or 2-3 pints of smaller fruit like berries
- Locally sourced, mostly organic; if not organic, will be eco-grown (more details available upon req.)
- *NBs:*
 - * *We are reducing the amount of fruit deliveries from 14 to 12, so the price reflects that.*
 - * *Price per share is the same as last year (~\$18)*

** We will NOT be receiving non-regional fruit as happened last year, so quality will not be compromised.*

3. MUSHROOMS - \$240 for 24 weeks

- Delivered weekly
- Certified organic exotic culinary mushrooms (oysters, lions mane, black trumpet, etc.)

4. FLOWERS - \$100 for 10 weeks

- Delivered 10 weeks, not consecutively, from July to October.
- Large, seasonal bouquets of flowers grown on Circle Brook Organic Farm. They're sold at farmers markets for \$12-15 each and will add local beauty to your home!

1. Pay for your share + any add-ons to Farmer John Kreuger by [Venmo](#) or check.

Please include your total for your veggie share + any add-ons, if applicable.

If you choose to pay by Venmo it is imperative that you note Middletown CSA, the share size and if you are buying eggs or Organic Fruit. **** please email middletownCSA@gmail.com with a screenshot or receipt to confirm payment ****

____ If you do not pick up your share on the scheduled date and within the time and have not made prior arrangements, your share will be donated.

_____ CSA newsletters, updates and info are sent via email and posted on our Facebook group. Newsletters are usually sent the day before pick-up day. We try to send other communications a week in advance. I will check my email at least weekly for CSA updates.

___ I understand that as part of my CSA membership I will volunteer for one shift of either set up or break down the weekly shares. If I am unable to make my shift, it is my responsibility to secure a replacement

I commit to membership in the Middletown CSA for the 2026 season which is planned to run for 24 weeks starting Friday, June 8 and ending Friday, November 16. As a member of the CSA, I will receive a weekly share of produce. The shares will vary by size and weight depending on the season.

One aspect of CSA is that members support their farmer by sharing in the inherent risks of agriculture (poor weather, drought, disease, early frost, crop failure and so on) and rewards (the bounty from a good season.) CSA farmers purposely plan for such contingencies and use growing techniques that protect the harvest, minimize risk to members and optimize the rewards: growing a wide variety of crops that thrive in different types of conditions, cover cropping, crop rotation, and irrigation. Moreover, the CSA builds relationships of trust between the farmer and the community group. On the whole, members should get a wide variety of vegetables in generous amounts. Therefore I agree that while John Krueger will act in good faith to provide fresh organic produce for the duration of the season, there is no guarantee of quantities or contents of weekly shares.

I am fully aware that it is necessary to inspect and wash all produce thoroughly before consuming. John, his workers, his farm, all CSA members and administrator, Alicia Meulensteen, and the settings we use to pick up our shares and their administrators and employees have no liability in terms of the safety of the food or the premises.

I am also fully aware that when driving, parking and picking up my CSA share at 21 Red Hill Road, Middletown, NJ, I do so willingly and the homeowners have no liability.
